

1.5.A.8 Inmate Operation of Vehicles

II Policy:

Inmates can operate vehicles consistent with the guidelines contained in this policy.

III Definitions:

Driver license:

"Driver license," is a document issued by a state or jurisdiction to an individual that authorizes the individual to drive motor vehicle types authorized by the license.

Public Roadways:

A public roadway is defined as all streets, alleys, public roads, public thoroughfares or highways.

Security Perimeter:

Fences and/or walls (including the exterior wall of a building) that provide for the secure confinement of offenders within a facility. All entrances and exits of a security perimeter are under the control of facility staff, thereby preventing an inmate from leaving the facility unsupervised or without permission.

Vehicle:

For the purposes of this policy, a vehicle includes all new or used vehicles propelled by any power other than muscular. Includes automobiles, trucks, off-road vehicles (self-propelled, two or more wheeled vehicles designed primarily to be operated on land other than a highway and includes, but is not limited to, all terrain vehicles, golf carts/mules and vehicles whose manufacturer's statement of origin {MSO} or manufacturer's certificate of origin {MCO} states the vehicle is not for highway use), farm vehicles (field tractors and other farm machinery) and other "low speed" vehicles (a four-wheeled motor vehicle not capable of exceeding 25 MPH on a paved level surface). This definition specifically excludes riding lawn mowers.

IV Procedures:

1. Driver License Requirements:

- A. Any inmate operating a motor vehicle which by state law requires a driver license to operate, will have a valid and proper driver license in his/her immediate possession when operating the vehicle (See SDCL § [32-12-39](#)).
1. Work supervisors are responsible for verifying an inmate has a valid and proper driver license prior to allowing the inmate to operate a vehicle(s) in a manner that requires the operator to have a valid driver license.
 - a. Inmates with a history of reckless or irresponsible behavior while operating a vehicle may be prohibited by DOC staff or the work site supervisor from operating a vehicle.

2. Application and/or Renewal of an Inmate Driver License:

- A. Inmates must receive prior approval from designated unit staff before renewing or applying for a driver license.
1. Minimum and Low Medium custody level inmates eligible for placement in Community Service or Work Release and parolees assigned to the Community Transition Program (CTP) may contact their unit staff to apply for or renew a driver license.
 2. Inmates who do not access the community due to their classification (Max, HM), who are within six (6) months of release to parole supervision or discharge, may contact their transition case manager to apply or renew a driver license.
 3. All fees and/or costs associated with an inmate applying for or renewing a driver license are the responsibility of inmate.
 4. Approval to apply for or renew a driver license is generally limited to the State of South Dakota. Exceptions may be granted by the unit manager.
- B. Inmates currently incarcerated for a third or subsequent DWI offense, vehicular battery, vehicular homicide or hit and run with injury, are not eligible to apply for a driver license while in the custody of the DOC (See SDCL §§ [22-16-41](#), [32-23-4](#), [32-23-4.6](#), [32-23-4.7](#) and [32-34-5](#)).
1. Any inmate prohibited by state law from operating a vehicle on a public roadway (includes revoked or suspended license), is ineligible to apply for or receive a driver license while in the custody of the DOC.
- C. Unit staff will consider an inmate's current and past institutional disciplinary record, criminal history (including motor vehicle violations), work/employment history while incarcerated, adjustment to incarceration, and any other relevant information when determining an inmate's eligibility to apply for or renew a driver license.
- D. Inmates will normally only be approved to apply for or renew a Class 1 driver license.
1. Testing for, or renewal of other classes of licenses (commercial driver license (CDL) must be approved by the inmate's Unit Manager. The Unit Manager may contact the inmate's employer to verify the need for a CDL.

2. Inmates are responsible for obtaining and presenting identification documents to the licensing agent at the time of application or renewal, as required by ARSD Chapter [61:18:08](#) and SDCL § [32-12-3.1-3.5](#) (See [Attachment 1](#)).
 3. Unit staff shall approve the day, time and location for an inmate to apply for or renew his/her license.
- E. Inmates who fail to pass the driver license test/exam may be granted an opportunity to re-test only after receiving approval from unit staff.
- F. Inmates are responsible for all duplicate license fees for lost, misplaced or destroyed driver licenses (See SDCL § [32-12-16](#)). The DOC is not responsible for lost, damaged or misplaced driver licenses.

3. Inmate Operation of a Vehicle:

- A. The following inmates are not eligible to operate a vehicle outside the security perimeter:
1. Any inmate convicted of vehicular battery, vehicular homicide or hit and run with injury (See SDCL §§ [32-23-4](#), [32-23-4.6](#), [32-23-4.7](#) and [32-34-5](#)).
- B. Inmates may operate vehicles outside the security perimeter of a DOC facility only after receiving prior authorization by designated DOC staff and/or the work supervisor.
- C. Inmates may operate designated state vehicles inside the security perimeter only after receiving specific authorization by the Warden. A state vehicle includes any vehicle owned, leased, rented or borrowed by the state
1. The Warden's authority to authorize an inmate to operate a state vehicle within a secure perimeter may not be delegated to others.
- D. Work Release inmates must secure advance approval from the respective Warden prior to operating any vehicle requiring a driver license on a public roadway (See DOC Policy [1.5.A.5 Work Release](#)).
1. Work Release inmates authorized by the Warden to operate a vehicle on a public roadway must be able to provide proof of adequate insurance coverage, or be insurable, as required by law (See SDCL § [32-35-113](#)).
- E. Inmates will obey all traffic laws and are legally and financially responsible for all traffic and parking fines incurred while operating a vehicle. Inmates may be held responsible for damage caused to property and or vehicles through acts of willful recklessness or negligence.
1. Violation of traffic laws or facility rules associated with, or otherwise related to the use and/or operation of a vehicle, may result in suspension or revocation of the inmate's authorization to operate a vehicle.
 2. Staff supervising the inmate shall report any known violations or infractions of traffic laws by an inmate directly to the DOC.
 3. Inmates will wear seat belts when operating a vehicle on a public roadway, in accordance with SDCL § [32-38-5](#).

- F. Inmates may not operate motorcycles, mopeds, motorbikes, dune buggies, snowmobiles, or motor homes.
- G. Work supervisors will ensure each inmate operating a vehicle receives any necessary vehicle-specific training prior to operating the vehicle.
- H. Inmates will drive vehicles from point to point without deviations from the most direct route.

4. Community Service Inmates:

- A. The following guidelines apply specifically to inmates on Community Service (See DOC Policy 1.5.A.6 [Community Service Program](#)):
 - 1. A Community Service inmates operation of a vehicle is restricted to official business (engaged in maintenance or other work assignments) and is generally limited to the grounds of federal, state and local government property/facilities or on the grounds of non-profit organizations.
 - a. Community Service inmates will not operate vehicles on public roadways, with the exception that inmates may operate vehicles on public roadways located within the confines or boundaries of federal, state or local government property, or public roadways directly adjacent to the boundaries of federal, state or local governmental property.

Driver License Fees effective 7-1-08

Driver License or ID Card – New or Renewal (Class 1, 2 or 3) is \$20.00
Commercial Driver License – New or Renewal is \$75.00
Commercial Driver License endorsement fees – \$10.00 each test
Duplicate Driver License or ID – \$10.00
Reinstatement fees – \$50 to \$200



New Requirements for All Driver License and ID Card Applicants Effective 12-31-09

Make your visit to the driver exam station a successful one. Learn about the new identification requirements so you'll be prepared when making application for a driver license or ID card.

Effective December 31, 2009, federal regulations require anyone applying for a new, renewal or duplicate driver license or identification card to provide the documents listed below.

ONE of the following to prove identity, date of birth, and lawful status:

- Certified U.S. birth certificate
- Valid unexpired U.S. passport
- Certificate of Naturalization
- Certificate of Citizenship
- Valid unexpired permanent resident card
- Valid unexpired employment authorization document
- Foreign passport with valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-04

If your name is different than the name on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree).

ONE document to prove Social Security number. The documents below serve as proof of Social Security number:

- Social Security card
- W-2 Form
- SSA 1099 Form
- Non SSA 1000 Form
- Pay stub (must include name and social security number)

TWO documents to prove your principal address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Please bring **two** of the documents listed below (each must contain your current address and have been issued within the last 90 days).

- Utility bill
- Credit card statement
- Pay stub or earnings statement
- Rental receipt
- Phone bill
- Transcript or report card from **ACCREDITED SCHOOL**
- The following must have been issued within the last year:
 - Bank statement
 - Mortgage document
 - Tax document
 - Homeowner's/renter's insurance policy

These new rules will help to establish a more secure driver license and will help address our shared concern about national security, identity theft, and terrorism safety.
