

1.5. C.2 Inmate Wellness

I Policy Index:



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Office of Primary Responsibility: DOC Administration

II Policy:

The Department of Corrections (DOC) provides all inmates with nutritional meals. Inmates will be afforded the opportunity for recreation/leisure activity on a regular basis and are encouraged to engage in some form of regular physical exercise.

III Definitions:

Inmate:

Any person sentenced or placed in a facility or program under the control of the Department of Corrections.

IV Procedure(s):

1. Nutrition:

- A. All inmates will be afforded the opportunity to access three nutritional meals a day, seven (7) days a week (ACA 4-4328)
- B. Dietary allowances will be reviewed and documented at least annually by a qualified nutritionist or registered dietician (ACA 4-4316).
 - 1. The facility will provide inmates with a balanced diet based on the United States Department of Agriculture and the Department of Human Services' Food Guide Pyramid. Meals will meet or exceed the recommended daily allowances, including the four (4) basic food groups and will be appropriate for the age, gender and activity level of the inmates served (ACA 4-4316).
- C. Special medical/therapeutic diets may be ordered by a physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, or dentist and should conform as closely as possible to the foods served to other inmates (ACA 4-4318) (See DOH policy P-F-02 -[Medical Diets](#) and DOC policy 1.5.F.2 [Inmate Religious and Alternative Diets](#))
- D. An inmate may request a religious or alternate diet by completing a *Request for Religious or Alternate Diet* form and submitting this to their respective cultural activities coordinator (See DOC policy 1.5.F.2 [Inmate Religious and Alternative Diets](#)).
- E. Inmates who have access to commissary remain responsible for maintaining a healthy diet and following any prescribed medical diet or religious/alternative diet they have requested and been granted.

- F. Regular meals shall not be withheld, nor will the standard menu be varied as a disciplinary sanction. Inmates will not be denied access to a nutritionally adequate diet as a means of modifying behavior. Access to commissary privileges may be withheld as a disciplinary sanction.
- G. Food services staff will plan menus in advance (typically a month) and substantially follow the approved planned menus (ACA 4-4317). The nutritionist or dietician must be notified of substantial changes in the menu by the food service supervisor, preferably in advance of the substitution. If this is not possible, notice shall be provided within the same week as the substitution/change occurred. Any substitutions in meals should be noted and should be of equal nutritional value (ACA 4-4317).
- H. Menus will be evaluated on a regular basis by designated staff/committees who will take into consideration the flavor, texture, temperature, appearance and palatability of the food items. Staff/committees shall take into consideration inmate eating preferences.
- I. Meal evaluations should be conducted at least quarterly by designated staff to verify adherence to the set menu and established basic serving sizes (ACA 4-4316).
- J. Staff planning and preparing meals will take into consideration food flavor, texture, temperature, appearance and palatability (ACA 4-4317).

2. Inmate Recreation:

- A. All inmates will be provided access to indoor and/or outdoor recreation/leisure areas at least one hour each day (ACA 4-4154), with the following exceptions:
 - 1. The inmate's involvement in recreation would pose an immediate threat to the safety and security of the facility.
 - 2. A medical order exists stating an inmate should not participate in recreation activities. The inmate may sign a medical refusal if they choose to participate in recreation activities or exercise that conflict with the medical order.
 - 3. Inmates placed on restricted status should be offered recreation/exercise at least one hour each day outside their cells at least five days per week, unless security or safety reasons dictate otherwise (ACA 4-4270).
 - 4. Weather conditions make it unsafe for inmates to be offered recreation or exercise activities. The type of activity and/or length of time allowed for the recreation or exercise activity may be limited or decreased due to health safety concerns (See DOC policy 1.5.C.1 [Weather Index Alert](#)).
- B. In addition to the procedures set forth within this policy, each institution may establish its own written rules, guidelines and/or operational memorandums relating to inmate recreation, indoor/outdoor activity and leisure-time activities for inmates.
 - 1. Designated staff are responsible for the procurement, inventory, replacement and repair of recreational/leisure-time equipment and supplies.
 - 2. Each facility will establish provisions and procedures for adequate staff supervision of inmates participating in recreation, exercise, leisure-time activities taking place indoors outdoors as necessary to preserve and ensure the safety and security of the institution, staff and inmates.
 - 3. Inmates will participate in recreation/leisure activities at their own risk.
