State Prison Inmate Walks Away from Community Service Jobsite

RAPID CITY, S.D.- Minimum-security inmate Alden Clair No Moccasin walked away from his community service job in Rapid City, SD on July 30, 2016. No Moccasin is housed at the Rapid City Community Work Center, but was working for his community service employer at the time he walked away.

No Moccasin, age 35, is Native American. He is approximately 6 feet tall, weighs 240 pounds and has brown hair and brown eyes.

He was sentenced in 2014 to 5 years and 6 months for a second-degree burglary conviction from Pennington County. Additional information is available on the Offender Locator at <u>http://doc.sd.gov/</u>.
