The mission of Mike Durfee State Prison is to provide care and custody of medium security male inmates utilizing evidence-based practices in the provision of employment, substance abuse and educational programs to promote pro-social conduct in preparation for successful return to society.

- Former University of South Dakota Springfield campus was converted into a prison in 1984
- Named for former student, teacher and correctional administrator Mike Durfee in 1999
- Primary custody level: Low-medium
- Mike Durfee State Prison (MDSP) is home to many vocational programs such as welding, machine tool, auto body, landscape/horticulture and auto mechanics
- The Governor's House program is located on the MDSP campus and offers inmates an opportunity to learn or polish skills while providing safe, affordable housing to South Dakota residents
- The warden of MDSP also oversees the Yankton and Rapid City Community Work Centers
